Gov. Reynolds issues disaster proclamation including the Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program and Iowa Disaster Case Advocacy program

Gov. Reynolds issued a disaster proclamation on April 18th in response to severe winter storms on April 17th. The governor's proclamation activated the Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program (IIAGP) and the Iowa Disaster Case Advocacy (IDCA) program.

West Central Community Action had 2 counties declared a disaster including: Fremont and Page Counties.

The Iowa Individual Assistance Grant Program (IIAGP) may provide up to \$7,000 of assistance, reimbursement and/or vendor voucher, for covered items to households at or below 200% of the federal poverty level. Application must be made through your local community action office. You may be eligible for repair or replacement of items damaged by severe storms. Potential applicants have 45 days from the date of proclamation to submit a claim (June 2, 2025).

The Iowa Disaster Case Advocacy (IDCA) program is to address serious needs to overcome disaster-related hardship, injury or adverse conditions. Disaster case advocates work with clients to create a disaster recovery plan and provide guidance and referrals. There are no income eligibility requirements for Disaster Case Advocacy and there is no direct financial assistance provide by Disaster Case Advocacy. Disaster Case Advocacy closes 180 days from the disaster proclamation.

Additionally, individuals affected by the storms/flooding are encouraged to report their damage/losses to their county Emergency Management office.
